Primary text: Acts 4:36 - 5:16

The setting: the full number of those who believed were of one heart and soul. -Acts 4:32

Barnabas means son of encouragement.

Luke 14:7-11 shows us that in the Kingdom of God, you don't have to promote yourself; God will give you all the recognition you need and deserve.

True greatness does not come from self-promotion!

The lie to the Apostles and Church was very serious because it was really to lie to God!

Matthew 13:24-30 - Parable of the Wheat and the Weeds

The most dangerous problem for the church was NOT <u>external</u> but <u>internal</u>.

If the Church, at the start, became hypocritical, it would lose its spiritual power.

Only a pure Church could turn the world upside down!

God is more interested in your <u>purity</u> than in your <u>prospects</u> for the future.

God is more interested in your <u>motives</u> than in what you do for Him!

God would rather have a small church that is pure than a big church that doesn't represent Him.

"We don't need bigger churches... We need bigger Christians" -Pastor David Engelhardt

Repentance leads to revival.

"How is it that you have agreed together to test the Spirit of the Lord?" -vs. 9 $\,$

"Hypocrisy" refers to the act of claiming to believe something but acting in a different manner.

The word is derived from the Greek term for "actor"—literally, "one who wears a mask."

Results of Judgment in the Life of the Church:

1) Fear and awe

It is recognition that God is holy and righteous, and just.

It is a recognition that sin is an awful offense against God that deserves punishment.

2) <u>A refined church & a new recognition of the cost of discipleship.</u>

If you joined this group, it was going to cost you something.

If you were there, would you have dared to join?

- 6. So why did more people convert?
- 7. Why should we fear the Lord?
- 8. Consider the statement: "We don't need bigger churches, we need bigger Christians" What does this statement mean for you?
