The church is both an <u>organism</u> and an <u>organization</u>.

Healthy things grow.

The problem in the church:

- 1) There is a perceived lack of concern.
- 2) There is an expectation that the leaders are going to fix the problem directly.

Early church structure:

- The 12 apostles
- Everyone else is a disciple

Disciple means "learner" or "student"

The Hebrews were

- Raised in Israel
- Spoke Aramaic
- Read OT in <u>Hebrew</u>

The Hellenists were

- Raised outside of Israel
- Spoke Greek
- Read the OT in the <u>Greek translation of the Hebrew -</u> <u>Septuagint</u>

Complaining is contagious.

There are six things that the Lord hates, seven that are an abomination to him... and one who sows discord among brothers. -Prov. 6

Prayer and the ministry of the Word are our primary calling as a church.

Qualifications of those chosen to serve

- 1) <u>Good reputation</u>
- 2) Full of the Holy Spirit
- 3) Full of wisdom

Wisdom is the proper application of knowledge.

All seven men chosen have Greek names.

The Greeks complain, and the church puts the Greeks in charge.

As a result of organization:

the Word of God continued to increase, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests became obedient to the faith. -Acts 6:7
