<u>Jericho</u> represents a place of <u>VICTORY</u>. A victory that the Lord has won for us.

Jordan means to **DESCEND**.

Community Group Discussion Questions

- 1) As a review, someone read Mark 16:15-18.
- 2) Someone read 2 Kings 2:9-10. What was required of Elisha to receive the power of God?
- 3) Based on question #2, how as Christians do, we keep our eyes on Jesus?
- 4) What are some things that can hinder us from keeping our eyes on Jesus?
- 5) There were four places that Elisha had to follow Elijah to before he received the power of God to serve God. Why do you think some believers stop and don't go to a place of death to self?
- 6) Someone read 1 Kings 18:30, when did the fire of God come? How do we rebuild the altar in our own lives? (The altar is a place of surrender to God).
- 7) Someone read Hebrews 12:14, have you ever surrendered something to the Lord and then after were able to see him work through your life more. Or after surrendering that thing, you were able to see the Lord's leading in your life more clearly.
- 8) Someone read 2 Kings 2:19-22. What made the water clean again? How does a surrendered Christian, living with the power of God in their lives help bring life to others?
